Interesting **NH law update**: This past summer the Governor signed into law an update that went into effect last month: **RSA 31:6-a Holiday Designations**. "Any municipality, town, village, or unincorporated place that adopts a holiday on a date indicated in RSA 288:1 shall use the appellation for such holiday designated in RSA 288:1 with respect to any official communication, publication, document, or calendars."

One impact appears to be that **Towns** will have to refer to the upcoming holiday on Oct. 14 as **Columbus Day rather than Indigenous Peoples' Day.** The 3rd Monday in January is officially "Martin Luther King, Jr. Civil Rights Day", and the 3rd Monday in February is "Washington's Birthday" not Presidents' Day.




