Food waste accounts for up to 24% of municipal solid waste. NH has a map to encourage composting at locations where food waste will be accepted.

At **Work Song Farm**, 244 Beech Hill Rd, Hopkinton, on-site food scrap composting is done through a bucket system, where participants can pick up empty buckets at the farm and return full buckets. Food scraps only, no paper products or other compostable single-use items accepted.


Miss Sue's News (for Kids)






