** Photo ID, such as a Driver's License or School ID

** Birth certificate or Passport/Card or Naturalization paperwork

** **Proof of Residency:** if your Driver's License only has a PO Box for an address, please provide something with your name and physical address, such as a car registration, lease, or utilities bill with **your** name on it.

Having these documents ready will help to make the process faster and easier. If you do not have everything, there are affidavits that may be filled out and signed.

--If you requested a copy of your birth certificate from the city you were born in, an electronic copy of your birth certificate is acceptable, as long as we can read it.

Due to a legislative amendment to House Bill 1179-FN, it now includes **Retired NH Veterans** and their spouse or surviving spouse. Veterans are considered retired after 20 years of service in the armed forces. Military ID and proof of NH residence are required for free admission. Thank you for your service!

Navigating Medicare Options




